**MUSEUM RECIPROCITY MONTH COMING IN FEBRUARY;  
SIXTEEN MIAMI-DADE MUSEUMS TO PARTICIPATE**

MIAMI BEACH, FL (January 9, 2006)—Join The Wolfsonian-FIU and you will join fifteen other museums in the Miami-Dade County area as part of the newly developed Museum Reciprocity Month, to be launched next month. Initiated by The Wolfsonian-FIU, the program will kick off with a party.

The goal of Museum Reciprocity Month is simple: join one museum, and you will have the ability to enjoy them all, during the month of February. Membership at any of the participating museums listed below grants the member a free pass for any of the other museums. Whether a person has been a longtime museum supporter or has just signed up, the program enables everyone to museum-hop and experience the Miami cultural scene. The month will be marked by a wide range of members-only programs at each institution, including exhibition openings, cocktail hours, family days, and educational lectures.

About The Wolfsonian-Florida International University

The Wolfsonian is a museum, library, and research center that uses objects to illustrate the persuasive power of art and design, to explore what it means to be modern, and to tell the story of social, historical, and technological changes that have transformed our world. The collections comprise approximately 120,000 objects from the period of 1885 to 1945—the height of the Industrial Revolution to the end of the Second World War—in a variety of media including furniture; industrial-design objects; works in glass, ceramics, and metal; rare books; periodicals; ephemera; works on paper; paintings; textiles; and medals.

The Wolfsonian is located at 1001 Washington Avenue, Miami Beach, Fla. Admission is \$7 adults; \$5 seniors, students, and children six-12; free for Wolfsonian members, State University System of Florida staff and students with ID, children under six, and Miami Beach residents with ID. The museum is open Monday, Tuesday, Saturday and Sunday from noon-6pm; Thursday and Friday from noon-9pm; and is closed on Wednesday.
